CLARK COUNTY DISTRICT COURT 40th DISTRICT

1. JUDGES.

The Clark County District Court is a state district court served by one judge. The judge serves in the statutorily designated departments of the court as follows:

The statutory authority for the organization and designation of this district court is found is found at A.C.A. §16-17-110 (31).

Court for all departments are held at Clark County Courthouse located at 412 Crittenden Street in Arkadelphia, Arkansas 71923.

Pursuant to Administrative Order No. 18, at the request of the majority of the district judges of a district court, with the concurrence of a majority of the circuit judges of a judicial circuit, the administrative judge of the judicial circuit may designate one or more licensed attorneys to serve as a small claims magistrate to preside over the small claims division of the district court.

A small claims magistrate shall possess the same qualifications as a district court judge. The appointment shall be filed in writing and filed with the District Court Clerk.

Criminal. The following duties are referred with respect to an investigation or prosecution of an offense lying within the exclusive jurisdiction of the circuit court:

- Issue Search Warrant Pursuant to Rule 13.1
- Issue Arrest Warrant Pursuant to Rule 7.1, or A.C.A 16-81-104
- Issue Summons Pursuant to Rule 6.1

- Reasonable Cause Determinations Pursuant to Rule 4.1(e)
- Conduct First Appearance Pursuant to Rule 8.1
- Appoint Counsel Pursuant to Rule 8.2
- Inform Defendant Pursuant to Rule 8.3
- Accept Plea of "Not Guilty" or "Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity"
- Conduct Pretrial Release Inquiry Rules 9.1, 9.2 and 9.
- Conduct Preliminary Hearing Pursuant to A.C.A. §16-93-307

Other criminal matters may be referred including authority to sign miscellaneous criminal orders of a non-adversarial nature. Examples of such non-adversarial orders include but are not limited to, orders involving the conversion of fines, fees, and court costs to community service, and orders applying funds received from the Great Arkansas Treasure Hunt to fines, fees, court costs, and restitution.

Digital Audio Recording Equipment

Sobriety Court (DWI Court) Arkadelphia – District Courtroom

a. Type of specialty docket or description of its operation:

The sessions for Sobriety Court have a team of probation officers from Southwest Probation Services that supervise defendants who have been admitted into this Court. Quapaw House, Father's House, Potter's Place, and Shalom Recovery Center are the treatment providers used.

These sessions are held every first Thursday of the month at 10:00 a.m.

b. Statutory or legal authority on which it is based:

When a specialty court program has not been expressly created through legislation, A.C.A. §16-10-139 (a)(4) provides authority for the Supreme Court to approve other specialty court programs. The Clark County District Court continues to operate a Sobriety Court (DWI Court) that has been approved by the Supreme Court in prior administrative plans.

c. Certification of compliance with all applicable sentencing laws, including assessment, collection and remittance of fines, fees, court costs and probation fees:

The Sobriety Court is in compliance with all applicable sentencing laws, including assessment, collection and remittance of fines, fees, court costs and probation fees.

d. Sources of funding:

Funding for this specialty court is allocated in our annual budget and approved by the Clark County Quorum Court.

a. Type of specialty docket or description of its operation:

The sessions for Felony Drug Court have a team of probation officers from Southwest Probation Services that supervise defendants who have been admitted into this Court. Quapaw House, Father's House, Potter's Place, and Shalom Recovery Center are the treatment providers used.

Felony Drug Court is held twice a month on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays at 9:00 a.m.

b. Statutory or legal authority on which it is based:

Drug Court programs are authorized under A.C.A. §16-98-301 et seq. Pursuant to A.C.A. §16-17-137, a state district judge may be authorized to preside over a drug court program in the administrative plan for the judicial circuit required by Administrative Order No. 14 and Administrative Order No. 18.

c. Certification of compliance with all applicable sentencing laws, including assessment, collection and remittance of fines, fees, court costs and probation fees:

The Felony Drug Court is in compliance with all applicable sentencing laws, including assessment, collection and remittance of fines, fees, court costs and probation fees.

d. Sources of funding:

Funding for this specialty court is allocated in the Circuit Court's annual budget and approved by the Clark County Quorum Court.

This specialty court was established in the circuit court administrative plan, but the judicial circuit does not have a circuit judge who is available to administer the specialty court on a consistent basis. Accordingly, the administrative plan for the judicial circuit required by Administrative Order No. 14 of the Supreme Court designated a district court judge to administer this specialty court program.
