

ORDER OF INTERIM SUSPENSION

Lisa Ballard, Executive Director of the Supreme Court Office of Professional Conduct, has presented to the Committee her verified Petition for Interim Suspension, pursuant to Section 16.A(3) of the Supreme Court Procedures Regulating Professional Conduct of Attorneys at Law (2011) (the "Procedures"), alleging Respondent Chad M. Green, Arkansas Bar No. 2003081, presently poses a substantial threat of serious harm to the public and to his clients if he continues to practice law. Also presented was a signed agreement, confirming consent by Chad M. Green to the interim suspension, and waiving a hearing in this matter.

The Arkansas Supreme Court Committee on Professional Conduct (the "Committee"), pursuant to the mandate of Section 16 of the Procedures, finds the Respondent engaged in conduct involving a substantial threat of serious harm to the public or to the lawyer's clients. The Committee finds that if Chad M. Green continues to practice law, the public will suffer irreparable harm; that the threatened injury to the public greatly outweighs any damage the Chad M. Green would suffer from the suspension; that Chad M. Green's suspension is not adverse to public interest; and that there is a substantial likelihood that The Office of Professional Conduct will meet its burden in proving serious misconduct violations of the Rule of Professional Conduct.

The Committee further finds that an interim suspension of Respondent's privilege to practice law under the authority of his Arkansas law license shall be imposed pursuant to Section 17.E(3)(c)(iii), of the Procedures (2011).

It is therefore ORDERED that Respondent Chad M. Green be, and he hereby is, **SUSPENDED** from the practice of law within this jurisdiction immediately upon the filing of this Order with the Clerk of the Arkansas Supreme Court.
