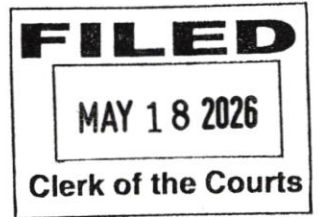

ORDER OF INTERIM SUSPENSION

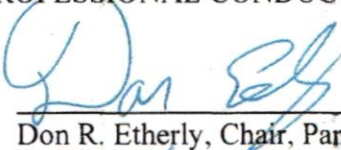
Robert Brech, Executive Director of the Supreme Court Office of Professional Conduct, has presented to the Committee his verified Petition to Modify Respondent's Modified Interim Suspension into Full Interim Suspension, pursuant to Section 16.A(3) of the Supreme Court Procedures Regulating Professional Conduct of Attorneys at Law (2011) (the "Procedures"), alleging Respondent Priscilla G. Copelin-Neeley, Arkansas Bar No. 2005242, presently poses a substantial threat of serious harm to the public and to her clients if she continues to practice law.

The Arkansas Supreme Court Committee on Professional Conduct (the "Committee"), pursuant to the mandate of Section 16 of the Procedures, finds the Respondent engaged in conduct involving a substantial threat of serious harm to the public or to the lawyer's clients. The Committee finds that if Copelin-Neeley continues to practice law in the State of Arkansas, the public will suffer irreparable harm; that the threatened injury to the public and the courts within the State of Arkansas greatly outweighs any damage that Priscilla Copelin-Neeley would suffer from a suspension; that Priscilla Copelin-Neeley's suspension is not adverse to public interest; and that there is a substantial likelihood that the Office of Professional Conduct will meet its burden in proving serious misconduct violations of the Rules of Professional Conduct.

The Committee further finds that this interim suspension of Priscilla Copelin-Neeley's privilege to practice law under the authority of her Arkansas law license shall be imposed pursuant to Section 17.E(3)(c)(i) and (iii), of the Procedures (2011).

It is therefore ORDERED that Respondent Priscilla Copelin-Neeley be, and she is hereby, **SUSPENDED** from the practice of law within the State of Arkansas immediately upon the filing of this Order with the Clerk of the Arkansas Supreme Court.
