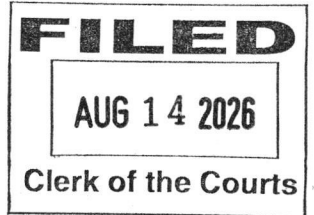

FINDINGS & CONSENT ORDER OF DISCIPLINE

The formal charges of misconduct upon which this Consent Order is premised, involving respondent attorney Kenton Carthal Cobb ("Cobb") of Conway, Arkansas, arose from information brought to the attention of the Office of Professional Conduct by Respondent Cobb, who self-reported.

Following Respondent Attorney's receipt of the formal complaint, the attorney entered into discussion with the Executive Director which has resulted in an agreement to discipline by consent, pursuant to Section 20.B of the Arkansas Supreme Court Procedures Regulating Professional Conduct of Attorneys at Law (2011), to be presented to a Panel of the Committee. Upon consideration of the formal complaint and attached exhibits, admissions made by the respondent attorney, the terms of the written consent, the agreement by the Executive Director and approval of Panel D of the Committee on Professional Conduct, the Committee on Professional Conduct finds:

1. The Wyoming State Bar, Board of Responsibility ("Board") and Cobb entered into an agreement in which Cobb admitted to violations of Wyoming Rules of Professional Conduct 1.1, 1.3, 1.4, and 8.4(c). The parties agreed to a recommendation of suspension from the practice of law in Wyoming for a period of three (3) months.
2. The Wyoming Supreme Court entered its Order of Three-Month Suspension on April 8, 2026, with the suspension effective on that date.

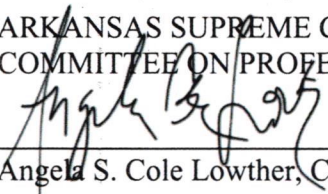
3. Pursuant to Section 14 of the Procedures of the Arkansas Supreme Court Regulating Professional Conduct of Attorneys at Law (2011), the Committee shall impose the identical disbarment, suspension, or transfer to disability inactive status to an Arkansas licensed attorney who is disbarred, suspended, or placed on disability inactive status from the practice of law in any other state, or federal court or a corresponding disciplinary authority of another jurisdiction.

4. That pursuant to the mandate of Procedures §14. F, the Committee hereby imposes the like sanction of a three (3) month suspension on Cobb's license to practice law in the State of Arkansas, with time served.

WHEREFORE, it is the decision and order of the Committee, through its Panel D, that Kenton Carthal Cobb, Arkansas Bar #2021236 be, and is hereby reciprocally suspended for a period of three (3) months. The record is to reflect time as served. Cobb shall pay costs in the amount of \$150.00 (ONE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS) pursuant to Section 18.A of the Procedures. In assessing a sanction, the attorney's lack of prior disciplinary history was a factor.

The cost assessed herein shall be payable by cashier's check or money order payable to the "Clerk, Arkansas Supreme Court" delivered to the Office of Professional Conduct within thirty (30) days of the date this Findings and Consent Order of Discipline is filed of record with the Clerk of the Arkansas Supreme Court.
